Statement of Faith

Since our foundation, faith has set Set Free apart. In everything we do – each well we drill, medical clinic we conduct, and child we rescue – Set Free seeks to provide freedom through Jesus Christ. Meeting humanitarian needs is our method, but making disciples is our mission.

Mission

Set Free envisions a world where all are set free in Christ.



Child Redemption Mission

We work to prevent child slavery, rescue children from slavery, and whenever possible, reunite them with their families. When reunification is not possible, our team cares for them and prepares them for a brighter future.

Water of Life Initiative

By drilling wells, we transform entire villages. The simple act of giving fresh, clean water changes individuals' lives and improves communities' health forever.

Health Restoration Clinics

Countless men, women, and children suffer from treatable illnesses in the villages we serve in Sierra Leone and India, so we provide mobile medical clinics to treat those who otherwise wouldn't have access.

Church Planting and Discipleship

Our pastor partners establish permanent churches in villages, enhancing their ability to build relationships, share the Gospel, and foster spiritual growth through Bible studies.

Where We Serve

INDIA

India, home to over 1.4 billion people—about 1 in 6 people living today—is the world's most populous country. Yet more than 21% of India's population lives on less than \$1.25 a day. Rapid population growth and climate change are placing severe strain on natural resources, especially water.

A major social challenge is the caste system, rooted in Hindu tradition, which divides society into rigid social classes that determine where people live, worship, study, work, and whom they marry. Below these castes are the "Untouchables," who are marginalized, barred from many jobs and temples, and often trapped in extreme poverty. Set Free works to transcend this system by sharing the message of Jesus Christ with the Untouchables, rescuing children from slavery, providing clean water, and meeting medical needs. ***Through partnerships with a network of more than 18,000 pastors, humanitarian aid opens doors to share a message of God's love with millions.***

But our mission in India is not without serious risk. Christian persecution is a constant threat, as radical groups seek to remove non-Hindus from India. Despite the danger, these pastors continue serving their communities—caring for rescued children and discipling their congregations with courage and perseverance.



SIERRA LEONE

With more than 7 million people comprising 16 different ethnic groups, Sierra Leone is a country where ***almost 70 percent of its citizens live in poverty.*** A predominantly Muslim country, Sierra Leone's recent history includes a brutal, 11-year-long civil war and an Ebola outbreak of epic proportions. All these challenges provide unique opportunities for Set Free to provide for the physical and spiritual needs of these people.

For many years, Set Free has operated in a district-by-district approach, choosing to focus on one geographic area with great needs before moving to the next area. In Sierra Leone, we have adopted the Kambia District, which is in the northern part of the country bordering Guinea. Kambia is a muslim stronghold where many unreached people groups live. Set Free is not only bringing access to clean water, but introducing the people of Kambia to Jesus Christ – the Living Water.

MESSAGE FROM HEAD PARTNER, PASTOR ALPHA:

This morning, I had the great privilege of traveling to Ma-Sampa Village in Sierra Leone for a special day of evangelism and the official handover of the newly constructed water well to the community.

I began the outreach by going from house to house, sharing the Gospel, praying with families, and personally inviting everyone to gather at the well for a time of fellowship and dedication. The Spirit of God moved powerfully during these visits. One community member shared that I was the first person ever to openly call on the Name of Jesus aloud in their village. Hearing this was deeply humbling. The people expressed that the love demonstrated through both the message of salvation and the gift of clean water deeply touched their hearts and opened them to receive Christ.

When we gathered at the well, I ministered the Word of God, sharing about the Living Water that never runs dry. With great attentiveness and sincerity, many responded to the Gospel and gave their lives to Christ. We prayed together, and I had the opportunity to pray for the sick and for families in need. There was a genuine sense of joy, peace, and spiritual hunger among the villagers.

The dedication of the well was a beautiful and emotional moment. The community expressed heartfelt gratitude to Set Free for providing access to clean, safe water. They testified that they felt remembered and valued, thanking God for His provision and for the love shown to them through this life-changing gift.

We give all glory and honor to God for what He has done in Ma-Sampa Village today. We trust that the seeds of faith planted will take deep root, and that this community will continue to grow both spiritually and physically as they walk in the light of Christ.

2025 was a year of focusing on repairs for existing wells and strengthening our partnerships on the ground so that we can be the best stewards of the work being done. Through these efforts, we've been able to refocus our efforts on new wells in 2026.

I serve as the pastor in Donakonda, a remote tribal village in Andhra Pradesh. For many years, **our community suffered deeply because we did not have access to safe drinking water.** Every day, women and children walked long distances under the hot sun to bring water home. Often the water was unclean. Sickness was common, children missed school, and families lived with constant hardship and uncertainty. Over time, several outside groups visited our village. They prayed with us, spoke kindly, and promised to help. Some even began drilling for water but stopped at shallow depths, concluding that water could not be found here. When those efforts failed, they did not return. With each broken promise, our people lost trust.

When the Set Free team came, our villagers were honest about their doubts. They asked directly, "Will you also leave us like the others?" Instead of being discouraged, the team accepted this challenge. They stayed with us and continued drilling—far deeper than anyone had attempted before. Even after crossing 900 feet, they did not give up. Then, from that great depth, fresh drinking water began to flow. I will never forget that moment. Elderly men and women wept openly. Mothers lifted their hands in prayer. Children rejoiced and celebrated. What many believed was impossible became a reality before our eyes. This well did more than provide water, it established trust and hope. For the first time, our people saw a promise fulfilled. Their confidence was renewed, not only in those who helped us, but also in the faithfulness of God.

Since that day, ministry in our village has grown stronger. When we speak about a living God who hears prayer and provides for His people, the community remembers the day water came from deep within the earth, and they trust His promises. The well has become the heart of Donakonda. As families gather to draw water, conversations begin. People ask questions. We pray together. Many are learning more about Jesus, and faith is growing in our village.

Today, our children are healthier, women no longer walk long distances for unsafe water, and hope has been restored. I thank God for this provision and for partners who did not give up on us.

CHILD REDEMPTION MISSION

OVERVIEW OF PREVENTION:

Lenders exploit desperate parents with high-interest loans, often taking children as repayment. Many parents, unaware of the terms, lose their children to mines or brothels. Set Free breaks this cycle by paying off the lenders and securing the children's freedom. Families then repay Set Free in affordable terms—cash or essentials—which are reinvested to free more children, creating a sustainable model of freedom.

OVERVIEW OF RESCUES:

Our network of 18,000+ pastors is alerted to where children are held in slavery—including quarries, factories, brothels, medical testing sites, and child sacrifice situations. They coordinate rescues by taking extreme precaution, acting in bravery, and implementing numerous safety measures so that the children cannot be found by those that held them as slaves. The children are brought to safe houses and given immediate care.

My name is Ishani. I married young and soon had 7 children. Not long ago, my husband got sick, and we couldn't pay for the medication he needed. If my husband dies, I will be shunned in my village, with no way to support myself. I felt so hopeless and scared. A loan agent came to my village offering a loan with 20% interest in exchange for 2 of our children being sent away to work if I failed to pay the loan back. I am ashamed of this decision, but my fear and hopelessness made me feel like I had no other choice. With the loan, I paid for my husband's treatment.

All too soon, the loan agents returned to collect the payment I owed. I started crying because I couldn't pay and felt so guilty for what my children were facing because of me. While I was crying, a pastor came to me and asked me what was wrong. I explained to him my situation, and the kind pastor prayed over me. During that prayer, I felt a connection to God for the first time. I felt peace that if I trusted Him, He would provide for us. As an Untouchable, it was difficult for me to believe this, but I told the pastor that if God showed me a way out of this situation, I would spend the rest of my life telling others about Him.



Within a month Set Free's partners came to my village and told me that my loan had been satisfied in full on my behalf. I was so shocked by this that I didn't believe it was true. **But then I remembered that God was one that performed miracles. My children were kept safe from whatever horrors they otherwise may have faced! This was my miracle!** I share my testimony with neighbors in our village, and so far 23 others have come to know Christ as well. I will always thank God and the network of pastors that helped me in my darkest hour.

2025 RESCUE

WHAT GOD DID WITH ONE MAN'S YES

In 2025, supporter Peter Manning stepped forward in extraordinary obedience and generosity to further our mission to eradicate child slavery in India. Joining with a small group of his family and business partners, Peter raised the funds needed to launch what was expected to be a rescue of approximately 1,000 children trapped in the horrors of child slavery in India's rock quarries. What unfolded was far beyond anything we could have imagined. Instead of **1,000**, **a historic rescue of 4,989 children in 17 rock quarries was completed—a powerful testament to God's plans being bigger than our own.** The scale of the miracle also meant rapidly adjusting logistics and resources to meet this overwhelming need.

Peter's heart for stewardship and surrender has been evident every step of the way. As he humbly puts it, "The money that's here on earth isn't mine, it's all God's. I came in with nothing and I'm going to leave with nothing. I'm just a manager of His money while I'm here. My time here on earth is to be used to glorify God and to use everything in my power to further His Kingdom." **That conviction has translated into tangible impact. Already, more than 1,000 of these children have been reunited with their families, a number that continues to rise as reunification efforts move forward.** Each reunion represents not just physical freedom, but freedom rooted in Christ.

Today, holistic care remains a central priority for the children in our care. With our central campus at capacity, we work alongside our network of pastor partners and an ever-expanding network of church homes to ensure every child receives shelter, nourishment, counseling, education, medical care, and the chance to learn of Jesus. What began as a bold step of faith has become one of the largest rescue missions in our ministry's history. Peter Manning's willingness to say "yes" helped make it possible—and the ripple effects of that obedience will echo for generations to come.

REUNIFICATION + ONGOING CARE

OVERVIEW OF REUNIFICATION:

While some children were sold into slavery by family, many are kidnapped or coerced. Our partners build relationships with families, carefully assess each situation, and work to reunite children safely with ongoing check-ins.

OVERVIEW OF ONGOING CARE AT CAMPUS AND CHURCH HOMES:

For children who cannot be safely reunited, our partners provide holistic care at our central campus or one of 800+ church homes — including meals, medical care, trauma counseling, education, vocational training, and Gospel guidance.

12,010 children are currently being cared for across **800+ church homes** and one central campus



My name is Jyotshna. I was born into a poor tribal family in India. When my family took a loan for my sister's dowry, a loan agent told my helpless mother I could work in his "company" to settle the debt. She agreed, believing I would be safe.

What awaited me was a slate mine. We were children, many under 14, forced to work from morning to night with bleeding hands — no school, no rest, no safety. We were given dry bread and dirty water. If we complained, we were beaten. We heard whispers of abuse, sex trafficking, and organ harvesting. I was terrified every single day.

One night, a rescue team arrived in the dark. A woman gently held my hand and said, "You're safe now." I didn't believe her, but I followed.

At a safe home, I slept in a bed and ate warm food for the first time in years. Set Free's head pastor partner treated me with love and dignity — while others saw a broken girl, he saw a future doctor. Through his encouragement, I started school, passed the medical entrance exam, and studied medicine for five years.

Today I am a doctor at a mission hospital, treating the poor and forgotten. Rescue is not just about saving a child from a place — it's about restoring a soul, a dream, a future. I am living proof that even a girl from the slate mines can wear a white coat.

During our recent medical clinic in the tribal village of Gidajam, villagers began gathering early—many had never seen a doctor before. In this remote area, traveling for care costs a full day’s wages, so illnesses often go untreated for months.

A 28-year-old mother arrived, extremely weak and suffering for four months from chest tightness, fatigue, body pains, and frequent fainting. She had stopped daily work and relied on local healers, who believed her condition was a curse. Examination revealed dangerously low blood pressure, severe anemia, and dehydration. She received iron supplements, oral rehydration solutions, and basic medicines, along with guidance for proper nutrition.

After a pastoral prayer, she felt a sudden peace and relief in her chest and even drank water for the first time in days. By evening, she walked to the team without support, reporting strength returning. The next morning, she returned smiling, saying she had slept peacefully for the first time in weeks. Her family shared with the village that prayer had brought calm and improvement.

The clinic became more than medical care—it brought hope, healing, and a moment of faith for the whole community. Villagers began requesting prayer for sickness, family struggles, and personal challenges.

Even brief visits like this can transform remote villages. Please continue to remember Gidajam in prayer, where hidden suffering has been met with healing, care, and hope.

CHURCH PLANTING & DISCIPLESHIP

PASTOR TRAINING STORY:

Baby Daniel's mother was tirelessly cooking over a fire to serve her village in the aftermath of a deadly cyclone when she realized that Daniel, who was held to her chest, had become severely burned. In panic, a humble vegetable seller stepped forward and prayed over him in Jesus' name — and Daniel revived. His mother immediately gave her life to Christ.

As he grew, Daniel wrestled with deep spiritual questions, fasting 21 days until God answered through Nehemiah 1:3 — **his calling was to bring hope to his own people living in "great trouble and disgrace."**

Today he preaches weekly across seven villages on a rented motorcycle, boldly reaching hundreds — even thousands — despite frequent persecution. **His dream is to train other leaders to stand beside him. With Level One Pastor Training, Daniel is being equipped to multiply the ministry God began the day He brought him back to life.**

Set Free's partnership with Revelation Media began through a chance meeting at a conference and has since grown into a meaningful collaboration focused on sharing the Gospel in accessible ways. Revelation Media, whose mission is to create and distribute media that is easy to understand and freely available, has supported Set Free by translating their The Real Story of Jesus film into multiple Indian languages and making it accessible via smartphones.

In addition, they have supplied thousands of coloring books and comic books based on the same story, which Set Free's partners distribute to rescued children. These resources provide an engaging, interactive way for children to connect with the story of Jesus and the Gospel, expanding both the reach and impact of Set Free's work. Additionally, this partnership has expanded into Set Free's work in Sierra Leone, supplying our indigenous pastors with useful resources in engaging people with the Gospel.

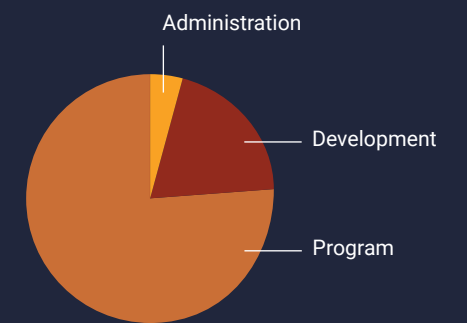

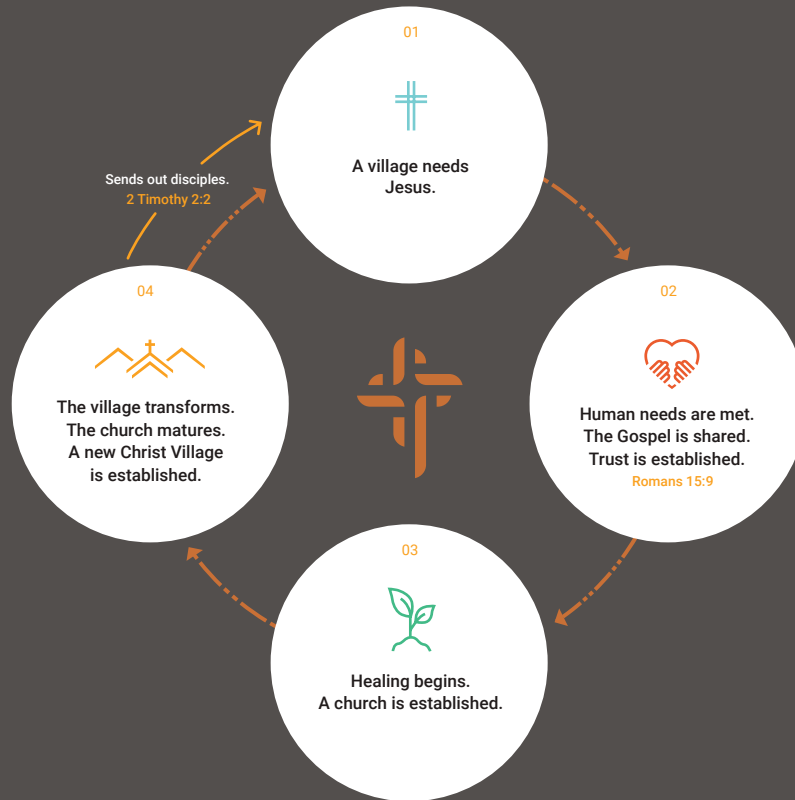
